## Windsor Ride Program

The Windsor Ride Program provides transportation assistance to residents (age 55 and older), who reside in Windsor, and are unable to drive themselves, or do not have alternate transportation, so they can attend medical-related appointments. Individuals who do not meet the age criteria but need ride assistance will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

The Windsor Ride Program can also be used for shopping to local businesses, banks, grocery stores, the post office, hardware stores, pharmacies, general stores, and salons. In addition, rides are also provided to and from the Friendly Fork Café Lunches at the Community Recreation Center. The following is a schedule of the days and times when appointments may be scheduled through the Senior Ride Program.

Please allow 45 minutes prior to your appointment time for pick-up and drive time for out-of-town rides, and 15 minutes for in-town rides.



### Walking Levels for Day Trips and Tours

The following Walking Levels will be assigned to each Active Adult trip or tour to help you decide which trips and tours are suitable for you. Each level is based upon research done by staff. The Windsor Community Recreation Center reserves the right to change levels, if necessary, when additional information becomes available.

#### **Easy**

Minimal walking, primarily flat surfaces.

#### **Moderate**

To fully participate there may be leisurely walking over primarily even surfaces and some uneven surfaces; standing may be required and possibly a few stairs.

#### **Difficult**

To fully participate there may be extended periods of walking over even and uneven surfaces and some incline. There may be steps and extended periods of standing. Participants with physical limitations should take this into account.



### Zoo (Denver)

Join us on a Denver Zoo safari and see why the Denver Zoo is considered a leader among its peers in design and planning for the future. The Denver Zoo Millennium Master Plan oversaw the development of Primate Panorama with two phases, one in 1996 and one in 2002, a new main entrance welcoming guests immediately to the award-winning Predator Ridge in 2004, and Toyota Elephant Passage in 2012. These improvements to the Denver Zoo have affirmed its place as a leader in exhibit design and visitor experience. The rotational exhibit concept introduced in Predator Ridge has been mimicked in exhibits all over the world, and was improved upon for Toyota Elephant Passage. This concept allows different species to be seen in the exhibits at different times by rotating animals through multiple habitats. This stimulates their minds, expands their experiences, and provides important exercise opportunities.

## Denver History Tours Presents: Lariat Loop Byway (Golden)

The Lariat Loop® Byway is a 40-mile route where you can retrace the motoring adventures of the early 1920s and experience the thrill of foothills exploration at the dawn of the Age of Motorcars. Colorado's first gateways to the mountains still have sharp curves, winding roads, spectacular views, and waysides to refresh and delight the traveler. This byway is a combination of two historic routes: the Lariat Trail Scenic Mountain Drive ascending Lookout Mountain and the Bear Creek Canyon Scenic Mountain Drive. In combination, these routes were part of several of the "scenic circles" developed and promoted by Denver in 1915 – 1920s to help Coloradans experience the mountains in proximity to the Denver Metropolitan area. Denver History Tours will provide a narrated history bus tour of Lariat Loop and will include rest stops and a lunch stop along the way (lunch on your own).

### Cherokee Ranch Castle (Sedalia)

Ahead lays the Great Hall with its soaring wooden arches and intricate cut-stone walls. To the left, a quiet study filled with treasures from world journeys. To the right, an expansive terrace offering magnificent views of the Rockies. Cherokee Castle's unique architecture combines aspects of the Western United States and a 1450s Scottish-style castle built in the 1920s. The castle is home to historic collections of fine art, furnishings, and memorabilia from around the world. A guided tour of the castle offers an intimate look upon one of Colorado's finest hidden gems and all of the treasures housed inside. The history of Cherokee Ranch and Castle Foundation, including the legacy of founder, Tweet Kimball, gives guests a great understanding and appreciation for the arts, education, and conservation. The driver will plan a stop for lunch on your own.

### Georgetown Loop Railroad (Georgetown)

The Georgetown Loop Railroad® was one of Colorado's first visitor attractions. Completed in 1884, this spectacular stretch of three-foot narrow gauge railroad was considered an engineering marvel for its time. In 1973, the Colorado Historical Society began restoring the railroad and the 978-acre Georgetown Loop Historic Mining and Railroad Park. On this tour, not only will you ride the historic narrow gauge loop railroad, but you will also take a walking tour of the Lebanon Silver Mine, located at the halfway point on the railroad. The mine

tour takes you 500 feet into a tunnel bored in the 1870s. Your guide will point out rich veins of silver and tell you about early-day mining. The temperature inside the mine is a constant 44° F, so bring a jacket. The tour also includes visits to the manager's office and the miners' change room. NOTE: the mine tour requires walking a very long distance on uneven surfaces and with low headroom. The driver will plan a quick stop for a late lunch, on your own, on the return ride home.

### Estes Park Museum (Estes Park)

The Estes Park Museum presents exhibits and programs detailing the history of the area with multiple exhibits and historical buildings. Step outside of the main building to explore two historical structures: the 1908 Cobb-Macdonald cabin and the Historic Boyd Building. The cabin is typical of a turn-of-the-20th-century rustic home and displays modest furniture and decorations. The Historic Boyd Building served as the headquarters for Rocky Mountain National Park when it was located downtown from 1915 to 1923. Today, the building hosts temporary exhibits. The final stop in the tour will be to the Fall River Hydro Plant. Constructed in 1909 to produce electricity for the Stanley Hotel and surrounding areas, F. O. Stanley sold the plant to the Public Service Company of Colorado in 1928. In 1945, the Town of Estes Park purchased and maintained the Hydro Plant until it was severely damaged in 1982 by the Lawn Lake Flood. The Historic Fall River Hydro Plant was restored and opened to the public and features original equipment installed by Stanley, machinery from an addition in 1921, and a diesel unit installed by the Public Service Company in 1938.

Interpretive panels document the growth of Estes Park, its insatiable need for electricity, and the Lawn Lake Flood disaster. The driver will plan a stop for lunch, on your own, before heading home.



